## **Ghost Stories**

Black Hills Area Ghost Towns by Wallace "Wally" Slattery

### ROCHFORD

I was going to write about Newcastle, Wyoming, a little town I am personally somewhat familiar with, but evidently people there don't want any publicity, as I didn't get a callback about their history. So we'll write about Rochford. Rochford is a favorite 'ghostie' of mine, partly because of its beauty and partly because of its picturesque ness. It was founded in 1877 by R. B. Hughes and M. D. Rochford, who gave the place the honor of his name. Because of the excellent mines found in the area, by 1878 it had 500 people 200 houses, a city block of stores, even a school. The Evangeline, Minnesota, Stand By, and Balkan mines all provided excellent work for decades to come, although the Balkan was the "weak sister" of the group. Its promoters were forced to "salt" the mine to promote it - with cutup gold coins, no less! This led to disaster when a group of would-be investors commented on the nugget inscribed "E Pluribus Unum." I don't know how they would have reacted if they'd found a nugget with an Indian head on it! Although Rochford is now a "ghost" of itself, with only a few dozen denizens, it is definitely worth checking out. There is the Rochford Mall, an excellent burger place (Note the hundreds of baseball caps stuck to the ceiling!), and the old city jail, among many picturesque buildings. The mills have largely been torn down, but the old workings are still there. Grab a gold pan and see what you find in Rapid Creek, and get some photos of the old buildings while you're at it.
