CASCADE


Cascade, south of Hot Springs, was founded in 1886 as a resort town for the warm springs there. A fancy hotel was built, and developers had high hopes that this would be a great metropolis as the train came through. Well, guess what? The train went elsewhere, and the town declined rapidly.

There are still ruins of the original hotel, and old homes from the business block are still there. The Cascade Springs still gush out large amounts of warm mineral water, creating a pretty scene.

The state of the town is indicated by the fact that I used to pass the place on Rt. 87 back in the early 60's, and didn't even know that it had been a town. But it's a very pretty area, worth visiting. A story about the area: back in 1961 my dad and I were running geophysical surveys near Edgemont.
