# ARGONAUT ADVENTURERS

Yeah, I had a problem getting a hold of the Adventurer I wanted to feature this month, so here goes....

I'm a native of northwest Nebraska, a ranch kid from down there, and my dad had been a gold prospector during the 1930's in the Black Hills. He was always interested in oil exploration and gold prospecting, and so I grew up in that environment. I remember going gold panning with him in the Black Hills as a kid - up California Gulch.

Well, I kinda grew away from it - became a teacher in Nebraska, California, and finally Pennsylvania. I do remember going gold panning in California, but never really had a good chance to do anything with it. I didn't even know there's a GPAA prospecting club in Pennsylvania. But I never lost my interest in prospecting, as my library would show! I did get into serious metal detecting for old coins and artifacts in Pennsylvania - and loved it. I joined the local metal detecting club, and was very active in it from about 1986 to 2000. My best find there was a 1756 Spanish 2-reales coin which had been counterstamped "GR" (George Rex [George the king]) by the British for use in Jamaica. Today the coin would fetch upwards of \$2,000 - it is RARE. I gave it to my youngest son, Dave (he was with me when I found it in 1985), and he's terribly proud of it. Incidentally, I found it in a public park in Bristol, PA.

My best prospecting find came in 1994 when I went to visit my parents who were living north of Phoenix, AZ. I called them, told them I was bringing a metal detector, and asked them if I could go gold prospecting with it. My dad contacted "John," a full-time prospector, and

we got together. It was guite an adventurer, which I won't fully relate. Just let me mention that we were chased away from our first site by two hunters who didn't want us to bother their hunting (they had guns and we didn't!). So we went to Turkey Creek west of Mayer. John was "whisking" for gold - whisk brooming the dirt away from the rocks in the dry wash, while I used the metal detector, of course. John found a small nugget, then I found a slightly larger one, then John found a "picker." After that John led me down the dry wash about a mile til we came to a place where the rocks overhung the wash and said, "Dig here, my partner found a nugget the size of a pea here." Right away my detector went off big-time, and John dug up a 2/3 ounce nugget! I'm very proud of it, and have willed it to my oldest grandson.

I love this club! It means a whole lot to me. I joined it immediately after retiring in Pennsylvania and moving out here in 2004. You members are a great lot, and I am delighted to know you. Keep up the good work - you are a special breed. If I haven't met you yet, come up and introduce yourself. I'm wearing the big sombrero with the rattlesnake skin hatband.


### GOLD

Crystals form as cubes or octahedra, but distinct examples are rare. The usual habits are as grains, flakes, nuggets, and dendritic masses. The bright, rich yellow color is resistant to tarnishing. Gold is often rich in silver, when it is paler in color. The streak is goldenyellow. Gold is opaque, and its luster is metallic.

- FORMATION Forms mainly in hydrothermal veins, often associated with quartz and sulfides. It also occurs in placer deposits of unconsolidated sand, and in sandstone and conglomerate. It is possible to find alluvial gold in grains or nuggets, in stream beds. Panning for gold by sifting the sediment is an age-old method of looking for this rare and valuable mineral. Gold can be confused with pyrite and chalcopyrite at first, but only a few tests are needed to identify it.
- TESTS Insoluble in all single acids; soluble in aqua regia.
