Born in Worthington, Minnesota, Vernon never started prospecting until about eight years ago, when he joined the GPAA. He did move to South Dakota in 1962, and tells me he was always interested in Western Americana, including pistols and prospecting - he just never got around to prospecting until later.

Then about 2002 he went gold prospecting through GPAA to Alaska. Vern still laughs ruefully about the fact that he was bothered with fine stuff in the tailings that he kept throwing away - until he was informed that it was GOLD DUST! Vernon admits that he seems to have better luck helping others prospect than he does when prospecting on his own. Vernon likes to prospect in Arizona he's prospected around Rich Hill and the Flagstaff region - I've been there and liked it. He also enjoyed prospecting around Dahlonega, Georgia. At the Crimson Mine he bought a sample of dirt and got a great find there - 1/4 ounce! He also

prospected around Thermal City, in North Carolina, where he noted the free use of powered suction dredges.

His best find he likes to discuss - 15 or 20 pickers in about as many minutes on the Garnet.

Vernon made an interesting comment "Our club is what it is all about." We
need to nourish and take care of it,
because it actively protects our rights as
prospectors in these beautiful hills.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**


### **September 18th Outing**
