WILD & WOOLY DAYS IN THE OLD BLACK HILLS

Scott (Quick Shot) Davis

We all know about famous or infamous personages of the old Black Hills, such as Wild Bill Hickock or Calamity Jane. Well, there were plenty of other characters, and perhaps I can bring them back to "life" with some varns about their deeds and misdeeds. Scott Davis (also known as Quick Shot) started driving freight wagons into the Hills from Cheyenne in 1876. He was driving a twenty-mule team near the Hat Creek stage station when he and other freighters were attacked by Lakota Sioux Indians. Together they held off the Indians until the US Cavalry arrived, allowing them to proceed on their way.

Afterwards he became a shotgun messenger on treasure stage coaches, usually riding up top with the driver. That - along with other armed guards - wasn't enough to deter robbers - the stakes were too seemingly good. On September 26, 1876, the stage was held up by Dunc Blackburn and James Wall near Jenny Stockade. Davis was shot in the thigh, but two months later was back on the job.

Davis was a tough hombre. That November Blackburn and Wall stole eight horses from the stage company.

Taking five soldiers along, Davis pursued them on a 375-mile trip, culminating in his capturing the two road agents west of South Pass in Wyoming. By that time he had left the soldiers alone, and he was alone. It didn't matter; he brought the men back by train to Cheyenne. When he arrived with his charges, he was surprised to see a big crowd gathered to see the man with enough gumption to capture two armed bandits by himself! In 1878 Davis led a posse after two road agents after a big Canyon Springs robbery. It is believed he led in the lynching of two men found hanging near the Jenny Stockade. It worked - they never robbed another stage line!

Scott Davis lived a long, full life, serving as a special guard for the Union Pacific Railroad and as a livestock inspector, passing away in 1927 in Denver. May his bones rest in peace.


